Tree Planting Program 2025

From my first few outings inspecting this year's plantings, it looks like survival rates will be higher than last year. Timely rains have supported strong growth, and a quick inspection shows most trees are thriving. Early plantings from August have already grown a few inches in some places.



This spring has brought rapid growth, something we haven't seen for a while. Now is the time to stay on top of weed control around your new seedlings, even if it's just a spot spray or mow around the trees. The first year is the most vital and vulnerable for young trees.





Reducing weed control now can lead to reduced competition over the coming months. Strong weeds, like Phalaris with deep roots, will steal valuable water, making it harder for your trees to establish and thrive.

Grant Success

We're pleased to share that our annual tree planting program has once again received funding through the 2025 Victorian Landcare Grants! This continued support allows us to keep delivering important on-ground works that improve biodiversity, provide shelter for livestock, and enhance our local landscapes.

Looking ahead to 2026, we're planning to expand the program by offering trees along with a small fencing rebate to eligible participants. This will help landholders who are planting within shelterbelt or habitat corridor guidelines to offset some of their fencing costs.

There will be strict guidelines and application dates for next year's program to help us manage the additional project coordination that comes with including fencing support.

Full details, including eligibility and timelines, will be shared in the December newsletter – so stay tuned!
