
travels with wife Bev to see the wildflowers in Western Australia.

Project Updates

Farm water security now and in the future

Our project in collaboration with the Cundare Duverney Landcare group and including participants from Cundare Duverney and Leslie Manor Landcare Groups is ending this month.


The project involved sampling of farm water bores at properties bordering the Corangamite lakes, extensive analysis of farm dam catchments and the completion of

farm water budgets and water security plans for project participants.

In the maps below, results of bore sampling from this project and a similar project being conducted across the wider LLPG area (and funded by the Future Drought Fund) have been used to estimate groundwater quality measures across the area. The first figure shows pH contours across the landscape, and the second shows electrical conductivity (a measure of the salinity of water).





Resources produced as part of this project include a fact sheet on interpreting water quality parameters for various farm water uses, detailed mapping that can improve farm water security awareness available for our area on the CCMA's Natural Resource Management Planning Portal, and a guide to conducting your own farm water budget for water planning purposes. These resources can be found on the LLPG website shortly or by contacting Alicia.

This project is a collaboration with Federation University's Centre for e-Research and Digital Innovation and was funded by the National Landcare Program Smart Farms Small Grants program from the Australian Department of Agriculture, Fisheries and Forestry.

Spiny Riceflower Project

Our spiny riceflower (SRF) project is also finishing this month. The project saw LLPG volunteers and community members get together to learn about SRF, conduct weeding bees at a SRF site affected by Phalaris and African weed orchid invasion, and setting up a long-term monitoring site at the Chatsworth Road remnant grassland.

SRF is critically endangered and very sensitive to soil disturbance. As a small plant it is easily overlooked, especially outside of its winter flowering season, and is easily affected by competition from grasses which shade the ground and prevent seed germination and seedling establishment.



As a result of the learnings of the project we are currently advocating for a cool burn at Chatsworth Road, and will continue to spread awareness about this grassland species.

This project is funded by Trust for Nature's <u>Pimelea</u> Conservation Trust.
