LLPG Tree Planting Program

We've submitted our 2023 tree order to OzTrees Nursery and are now ready to start accepting orders from members for next year. This year we are requesting that **all tree orders are confirmed in writing**. There is a simple <u>order form available on our website</u> or you can request a copy by contacting Alicia.

Alicia is in the process of mapping trees planted in 2022 so if you had trees this year, expect a call and a visit soon. If you hired the mounder, you will also receive an invoice soon. Our 2022 tree order was funded through the Victorian Landcare Grants Program, and the Stockyard Hill and Berrybank Wind Farms Community Grants Programs.

Start site preparation early!

The best plantations start and finish with good weed control! For best results, start the spring prior to planting. If you've already selected a site for your 2023 trees, assess how you can get a start on weed control NOW before summer kicks in and get in touch if you have any questions.

Serrated Tussock Grants

The Victorian Serrated Tussock Working Party (VSTWP) offers grants that support community groups and organisations to build their capacity to achieve long-term voluntary management of serrated tussock. Have you seen serrated tussock locally?

Serrated tussock is not common in our area but is prevalent to the east of us. This species can be devastating to pastures once established so vigilance is required to prevent spread. If you believe you have seen serrated tussock in the district or would like more information on how to identify or control it, contact Alicia.

Serrated tussock can look like other native and invasive tussock grasses, so look closely and seek help if you are unsure. In warmer months, serrated tussock turns a lime green colour when most other native grasses yellow. Seeds mature in late spring and summer and heads are tinged purple. In late autumn/winter, plants are bleached by frosts and cooler weather to a golden yellow colour.






Mature plants have a droopy appearance and can grow up to 50cm high. Leaves are stiff, narrow, and rolled longitudinally. Tiny serrations can be felt when you run your fingers towards the base of the leaves.

Wildlife in our midst

LLPG committee member Liz Thornton and her family found two baby galahs on the ground after their tree came down in a storm. They moved them away from the road, protected them at night and let them roam during the day. After two days a family of galahs started circling and squawking and the babies responded. When they landed and attended to the babies, Liz felt sure the family had been

reunited. We all hope they're still living happily somewhere close by.

We've also had some LLPG members from near Mingay report an abundance of blue tongued lizards this year, and a special experience with a grey fantail! While working in their shed, the member was surprised when the fantail flew in and perched on their



shoulder, happily tweeting for about 30 seconds before flying off!

Greening Lismore Primary School

Thanks to a Woolworths Junior Landcare Grant, LLPG and the students and teachers at Lismore Primary School planted garden beds in front of the school last month. We selected locally native grassland species and the kids enjoyed learning their names. Some of the favourites were billy buttons, chocolate lily, and pig face!

We also planted some fruit and vegetable seedlings for the school's community garden, and the students learned about what plants need to grow and the importance of fresh fruit and vegetables for a healthy diet.
